#### SS.10: First Nations Current Events Project

How have the relations between First-Nations (Metis) and Europeans shaped Canada?

<u>Purpose/Objective:</u> to connect past events, relations and government policies to the present. In what ways has Canadian history, specifically in regards to First-Nations and Metis communities shaped society, social norms, current movements and events?

### **Research Criteria:**

Provide **background** information, what factors led to the problem and the **current standing** of the issue.

- o **WHO** is the topic about? **WHO** is involved?
- o **WHAT** is happening? **WHAT** is the topic about? **WHAT** happened in history?
- o WHEN did this happen? or WHEN is it going to happen?
- o WHERE did the event(s)/issue(s) occur?
- o WHY did these event(s)/issue(s) happen? WHY is it relevant/important?
- o **HOW** has this topic, event, issue shaped Canada?

# Research Component: (All Group Members) minimum of 4 sources per group

- o **Two sources** from a **library database** provided (360 or CPIQ).
- o **Two articles** or **periodicals** in First Nations, Metis perspectives.
- Other sources can be used in addition; interviews, video clips, images, books etc.

## Work Cited and Note Taking: (All Group Members)

- o All members --note taking and research.
- o All members will contribute to the group's Work Cited.
- Only **one** Work Cited needs to be submitted by the group.
- o Every group member will hand in a form with notes and their sources.

## Presentation Preparation: IPad/ IMovie component; divided up by group members

The project is a mini documentary or report about the current event/ issue at hand. Students can act as reporters or present the information as a documentary and act out the event or issue. Students can also do a combination of both.

- o Production; planning, acting & speaking.
- o Compiling images, videos, sound and information.
- o Filming
- o Editing
