Course Objectives:

- Continue the critical understanding of novels, short stories, poetry, plays, and essays
- Continue building skills in writing of multi-paragraph compositions and essays
- Practice writing a variety of creative forms (poetry, short story, etc.)
- Improve language skills through practicing grammar, vocabulary, and self/peer editing
- Work collaboratively with other students and practice speaking and listening skills in group discussions, presentations, and debates
- Continue learning certain types of poetry and poetic terms
- Continue learning important short story/novel terms such as character, plot, setting, etc.
- Read, discuss, and analyze various media forms such as print media, internet, advertisements, etc.
- Improve critical thinking and analyzing skills

EXPECTATIONS

1. ATTENDANCE:

- Students are expected to be in class, every class, on time. If a student is **late**, they should enter the class quietly and quickly and without disturbing the class. If a student is chronically late a note will be required and/or parents will be informed.
- Students should notify the teacher in advance if they are going to be absent.
- If a student is **absent**, a note on the first day back is required. The note must include: student's name, student number, dates absent, reason for absence, and parent's signature. If no note is given parents will be informed and marks may be deducted.
- If a test or in-class assignment is missed the student must provide a note in order to make up the missed test
- NO make up tests for major test/essays unless a note is provided

- All assignments must be **double spaced**, if hand-written it should be in blue or black **ink**, if typed it should be in **12 point font Times New Roman**
- All assignments should be neat and presentable and handed in on time
- If there are issues with getting work completed on time, please see the teacher for assistance or guidance. ** Late work will not be accepted after the assignment has been marked and returned to the class.

3. PARTICIPATION:

Students are expected to

- contribute to class discussions.
- show respect for themselves, their classmates, and the teacher.
- come to class with **ALL** of the necessary supplies including paper, pens/pencil, text book, novel, workbook, etc.
- come to class prepared to learn and contribute to the class.
- have completed all the homework assigned neatly and thoroughly.
