Autobiography Assignment

ASSIGNMENT:

1. **Oral Presentation** – You will prepare a story about your life. Below, you will find a list of ideas that will help you in writing your autobiography. You will present your autobiography to the class in



the form of a speech. You may have cue cards with you but it is expected that you will not read off of a prepared script. Props and photos are encouraged. Refer to visuals in your pamphlet. Sharing personal stories will help engage your audience and help your fellow students get to know you better as well! Your goal is to aim for a presentation that lasts 5 minutes long. At the end of the presentation, you will be asked a minimum of 3 questions from the audience.



2. **Pamphlet** – You will create a pamphlet (or something similar) describing yourself. Your pamphlet will have at least three sections (see below). You should include topics from these three sections but don't let the list limit you! You should include photos, pictures of your hobbies, interests, etc. and information about yourself and what makes you unique.

EVALUATION:
