Over two mornings, April 14 and May 12, English 10 Enriched students took part in the third annual Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion Youth Conference. Organized by students at VSB secondary schools both mornings gave students opportunities to learn from Ruby Smith Diaz (a Chilean, Jamaican, and Canadian educator who founded the Tierra Negra Arts which offers art workshops to empower youth to build community and explore activism), Chinyere Eni (an Igbo-Indigenous Canadian VSB and UBC alumna who is an executive with RBE can who lost her left leg to cancer as a child and who is an active supporter of War Amps and the Canadian Cancer Society), and Martin Boyce (who was at the Stonewall Inn in New York City fifty years ago when the police raided the Inn and arrested patrons for being gay and who shared his own history and the changes in LGBTQIA2S since the raid.)

Math Contests

Math Contests this year were another great success! We had so many students partake in everything from the COMC (Canadian Open Mathematics Competition) in the Fall to Math Challengers in the Spring to all of the levels offered by Waterloo and ASMA throughout the year. As always, Odyssey students are keen participants and they represent our program well.

In Math Challengers both our grade 9 and 10 team finished first and third place respectively in the Regional Competition. In the grade 10 Cayley competition, our school was the Zone Team Champion. Among the many other Waterloo contests, we had several students place in the top 25 % earning them certificates of distinction. 




Students in Ms. Pratt's English 9 class

Odyssey students are typically well rounded, they play on extracurricular teams, many play one or more instruments, and have many hobbies and passions.


