## **VDSF 2024** Vancouver District Science Fair



Congratulations to our grade 12 students who participated in the 46th Physics Olympics (https://physoly.phas.ubc.ca/) that was held at UBC on March 9th, 2024! Every year, teams from high schools across British Columbia compete in six physics & astronomy events. DT's designated coach, Mr. Borges, helped lead the students through a series of events. This full-day experience is comprised of two pre-built projects, two labs, Fermi questions, and a physics quiz game called "Quizzics". For the pre-builds, the students worked on a solar panel car and a cooler only using room temperature water. There was a tremendous amount of talent and skills from the students. Everyone enjoyed the day, made friends, and learned a lot from the experience!

# **Food Share Market**

Food insecurity is a real issue within our David Thompson learning community. A recent report from Food Banks Canada states that "one-third of Food Banks' clients are children." Also, the CityNews Everywhere article states that "the Greater Vancouver Food Banks Executive Cynthia Boulter says they see parents who are skipping meals so their children can eat, people who haven't eaten for days, and seniors who haven't had fresh produce in months." Already, hunger and poverty are detrimental to families, which in turn may affect the emotional and physical wellbeing of students (and their future learning outcomes).

Moreover, clubs like DT Fellowship, Time & Effort, and the Community School Team (CST) have been working together for three years to open a "Food Share Market" (a free mini-grocery store for families) in the CST office (room 108) for three days before each major school break when the Lunch Program is unavailable. In the past, our financial and food donations come from staff (between 6-8 staff donors). However, recently, a special grant given to the school and food donations from the Sunset Community Centre (through the Greater Vancouver Food Bank) are sustaining this program. We are the only high school in Vancouver to offer this market for DT students and their families.

Furthermore, student volunteers gain increased perspectives on social responsibility and empathy for those, who are experiencing unique circumstances. We hope that by highlighting this Food Share Market that greater awareness and increased efforts be made to improve the lives of members of our David Thompson community.



#### Outreach Event Hosted by the Society for Reproductive Investigation

The Society for Reproductive Investigation (SRI) hosted our students at the Vancouver Convention Centre to meet professionals, graduate students, and postdoctoral researchers in the field of female reproduction systems that are making major advancements in health care.

The event featured interactive tables where small groups of high school students rotated between tables, each focused on different topics ranging from career-related discussions, such as life in undergrad and grad school, to content-related explorations like pregnancy research, endometriosis, and mental health.

We're incredibly proud of our students for seizing this unique opportunity to explore the fascinating world of reproductive research. By engaging with experts in the field and delving into realworld research examples, our students gained valuable insights into the importance of science and its impact on society.





## Vancouver Art Gallery Field Trip








